- 1 **API102A with Theodore Panayotou:** According to the Coop, seven books were "Required Reading" costing a total of \$913.50. According to the syllabus it seems that only 2 of the books are required costing a total of \$265.50.
- 2 **API306 with Dogan:** Offered one "Available Online, Optional" packet for a potential savings of \$53.65.
- 3 **API461 with Fred Schauer:** Offered one "Available Online" packet for a potential savings of \$76.96.
- 4 **ISP202 with Graham Allison:** Offered one "Available Online" packet for a potential savings of \$130.98.
- 5 **ISP221 with Samantha Power:** Offered five "Available Online" packets for a potential savings of \$107.30.
- 6 **PAL107 with Williams:** Offered one "Available Online" packet for a potential savings of \$34.00.
- 7 **PAL210 with David King:** Packet #3 for this course was the book "Setting Course: A Congressional Management Guide".
