

Duane Champagne is a member of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa from North Dakota. He is Professor of Sociology and American Indian Studies, a member of the Faculty Advisory Committee for the UCLA Native Nations Law and Policy Center, and is Acting Director of the Tribal Learning Community and Educational Exchange (TLCEE). Professor Champagne was Director of the UCLA American Indian Studies Center from 1991-2002 and editor of the *American Indian Culture and Research Journal* from 1986-2003. He has authored or edited over one hundred publications including *Native America: Portraits of the Peoples*, *The Native North American Almanac*, and *Social Order and Political Change: Constitutional Governments Among the Cherokee, Choctaw, Chickasaw and Creek*. Champagne's research focuses primarily on issues of social and cultural change in both historical and contemporary Native American communities. He has written about social change in a variety of Indian communities including: Cherokee, Tlingit, Iroquois, Delaware, Choctaw, Northern Cheyenne, Creek, California Indians, and others.
