In the Fall of 2005, the Peabody Museum and Department of Anthropology will be conducting archaeological excavations just outside of Massachusetts and Matthews Halls. The excavations are undertaken as a course, *Anthropology 1130: Archaeology of Harvard Yard*, in which students gain academic experience and field experience in historic archaeology. The excavations are located in the Old Harvard Yard near the presumed location of the Harvard Indian College, the first brick building erected in the yard in 1655 and housed the college printing press in which the first Bible in North America was printed in the Algonquian translation by John Eliot. This year of 2005 marks the 350th anniversary of the Harvard Indian College, and we hope you will join us in this ceremony to honor, learn, and share in our living Harvard history.
