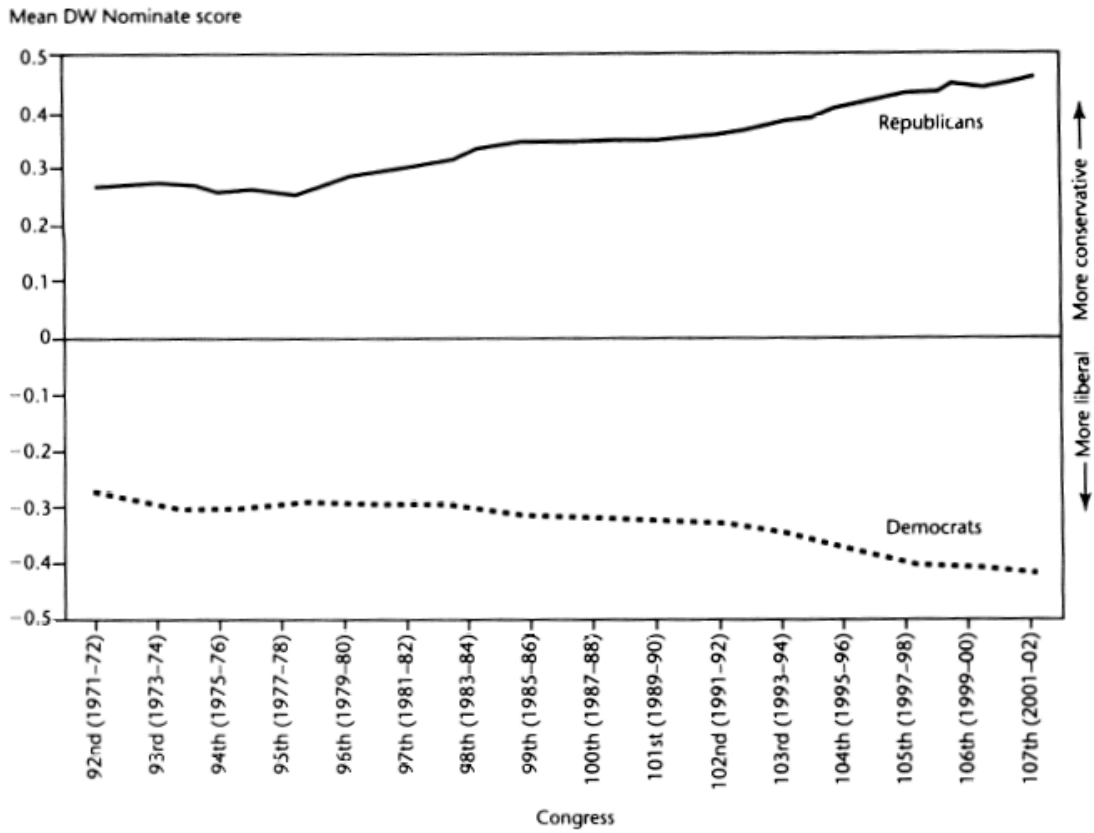


FIGURE 2 IDEOLOGICAL TRENDS IN ROLL CALL VOTING IN THE UNITED STATES SENATE, 1971-2002

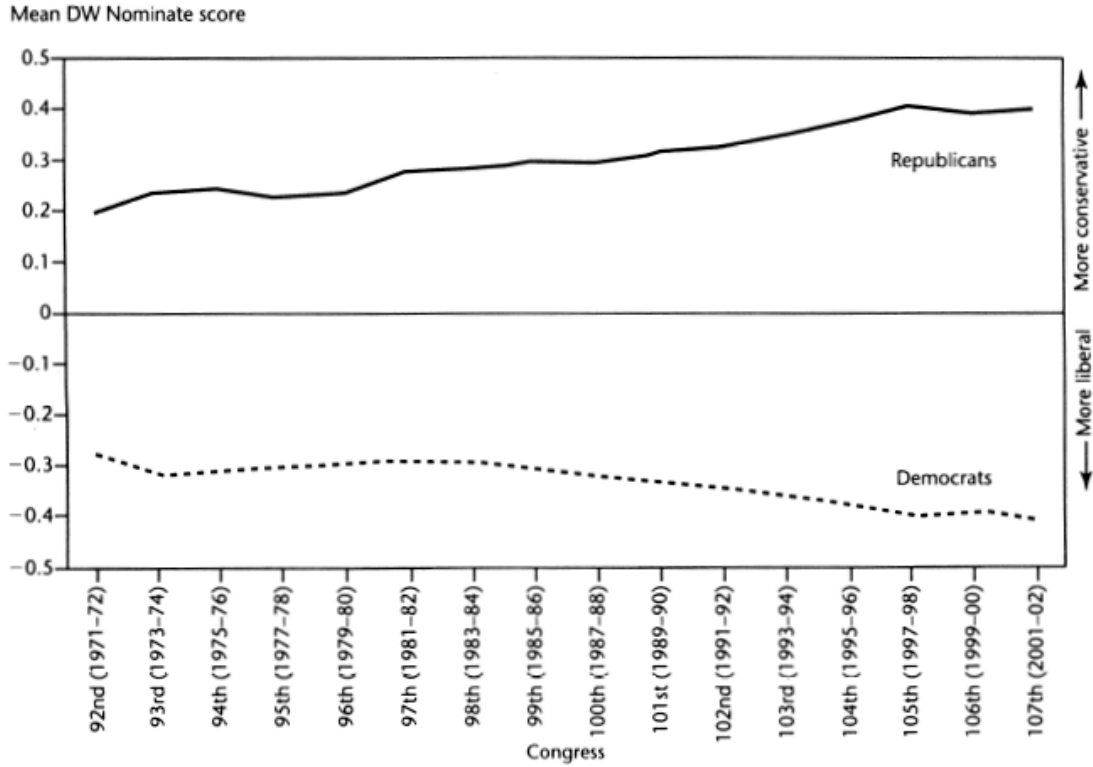


Figure 3: Trends in Foreign and Domestic Policy Bipartisanship, 1889-2002, Congresses 51-107

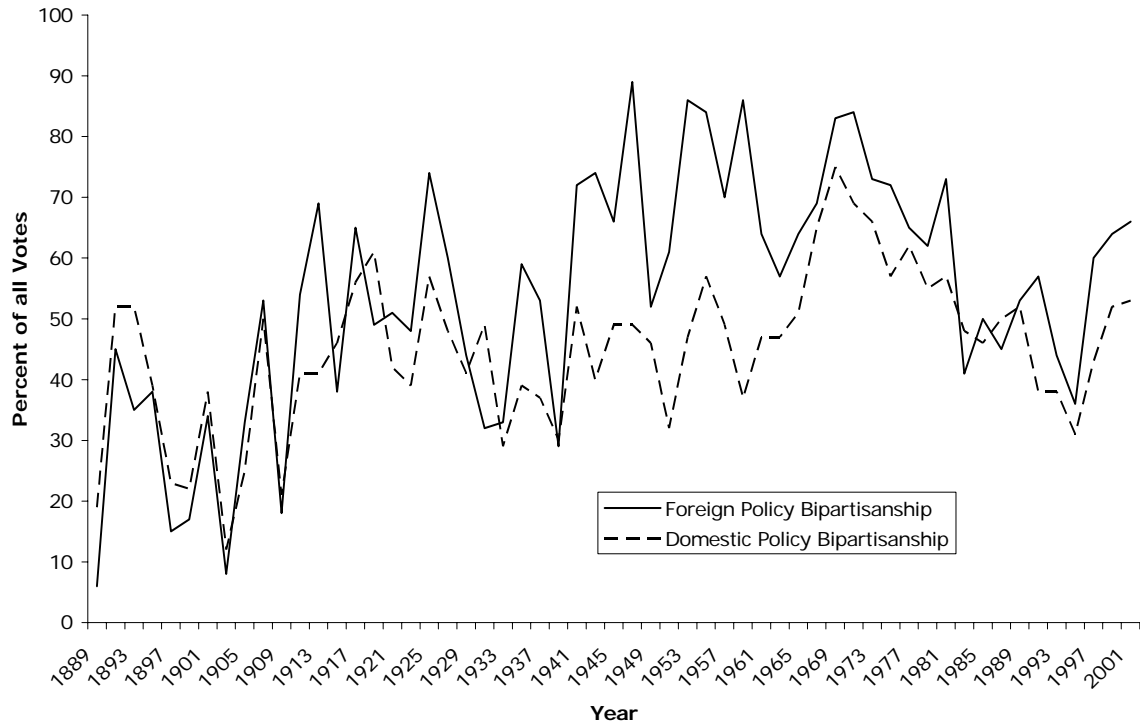
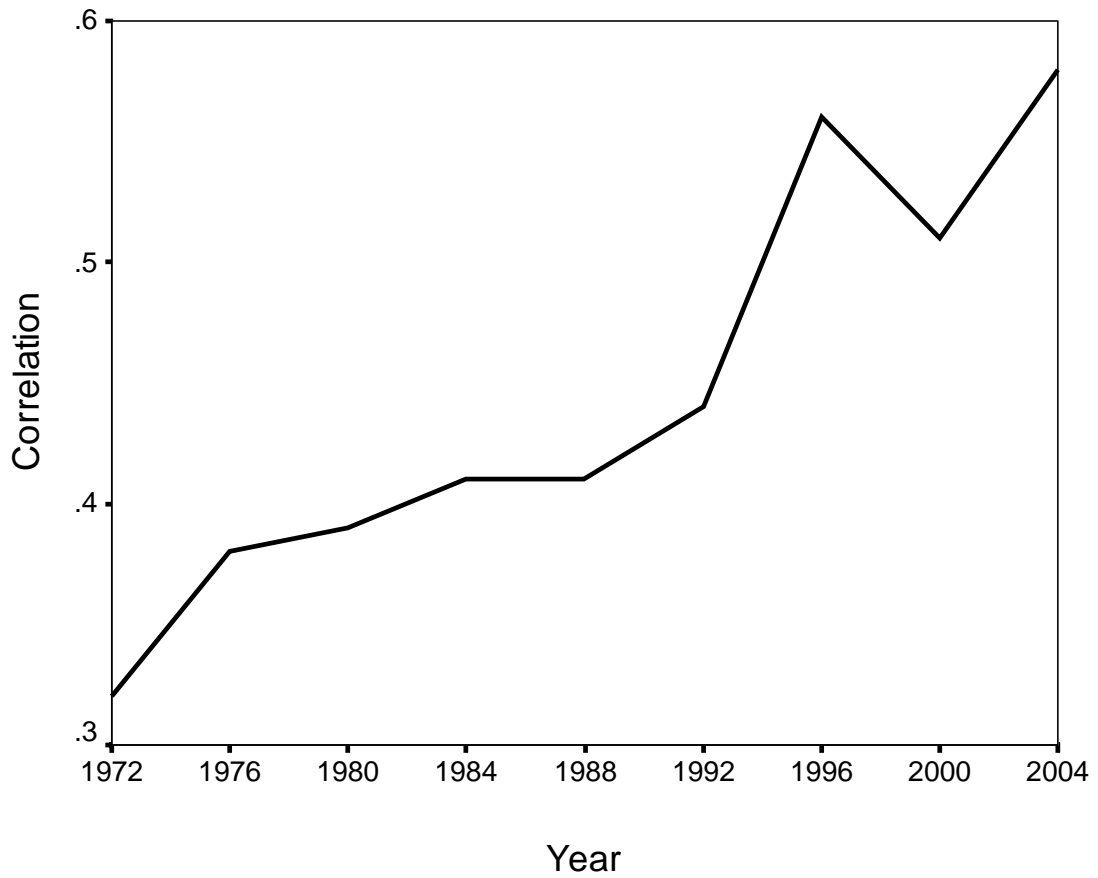


Figure 4 Correlation of Party Identification with Liberal-Conservative Identification, 1972-2004

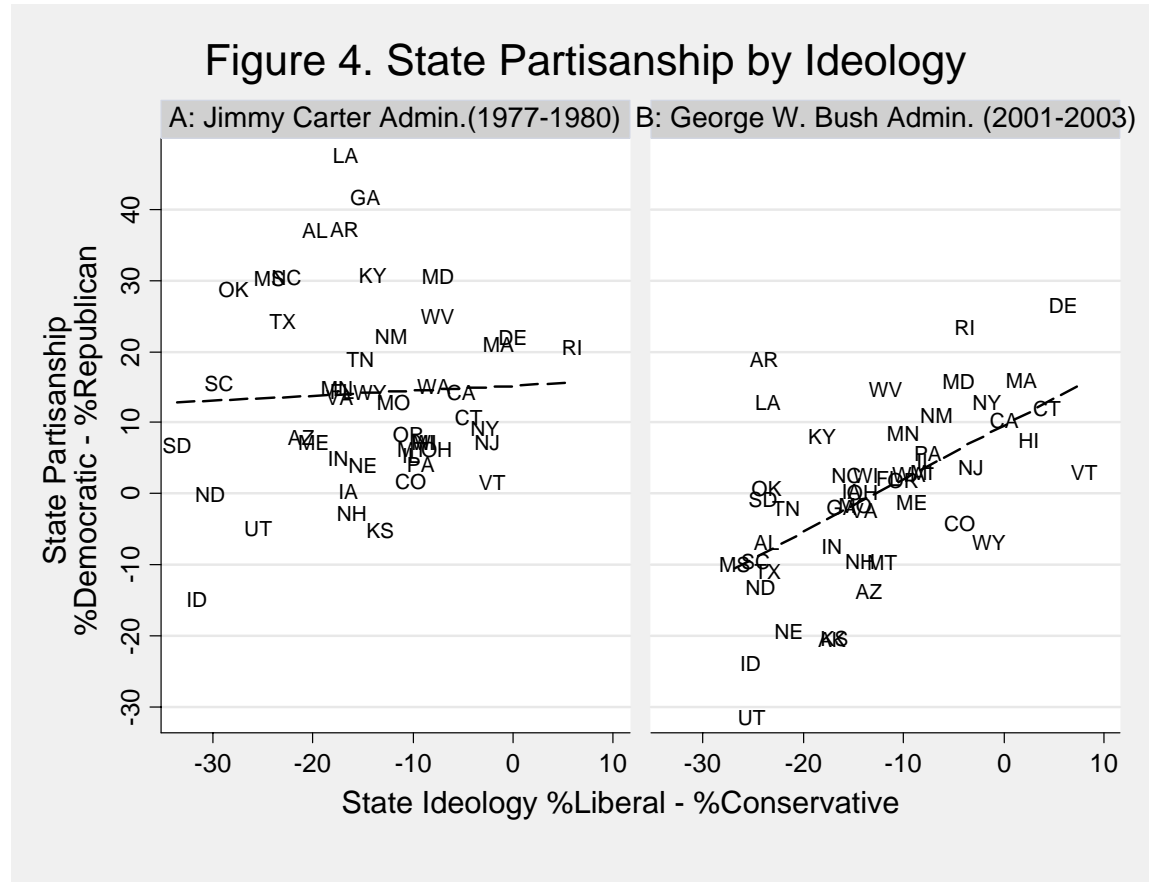


Figure 6 Presidential Approval (Percent) by Partisanship

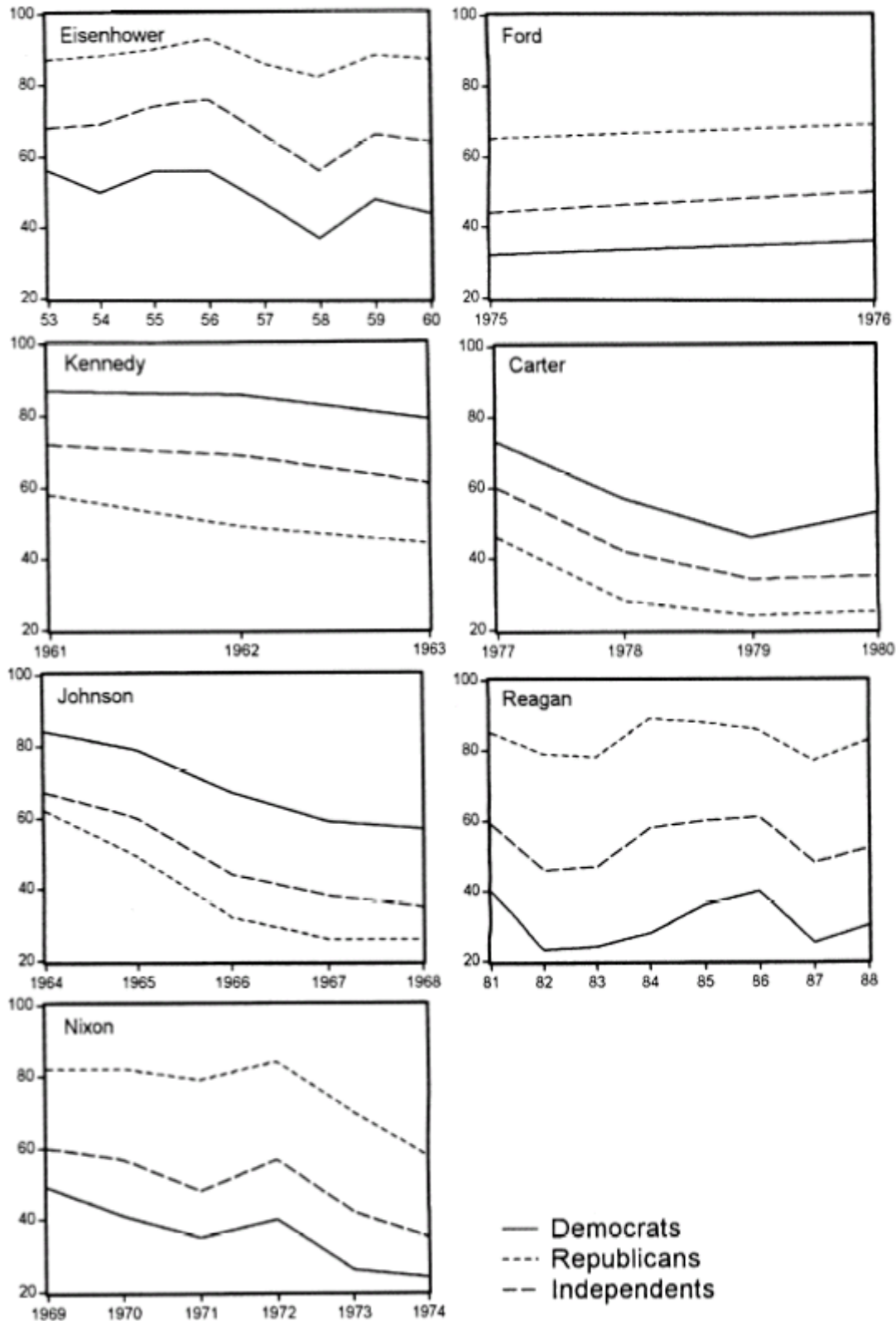
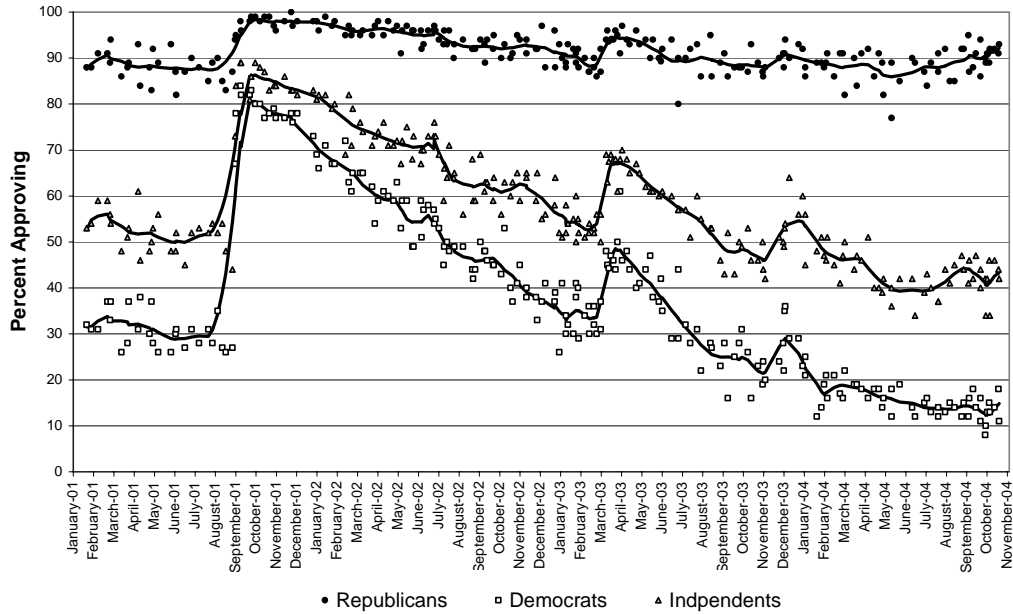


FIGURE 7 PARTISANSHIP AND APPROVAL OF PRESIDENT GEORGE W. BUSH'S PERFORMANCE, 2001-2004 (SOURCE: JACOBSON, 2005b, Figure 4, p.205)

Figure 4 Partisanship and Approval of G.W. Bush's Performance

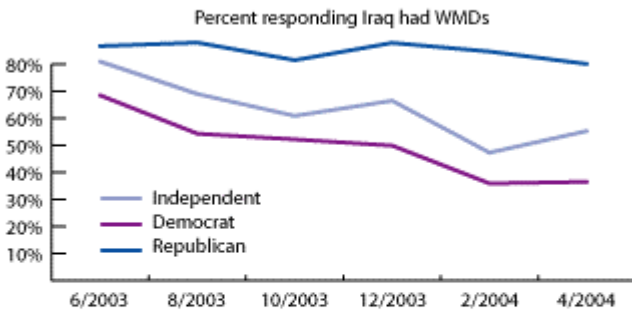

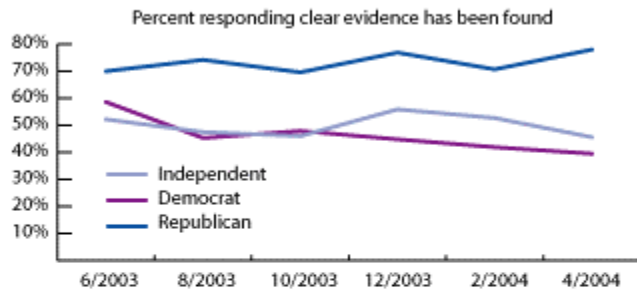

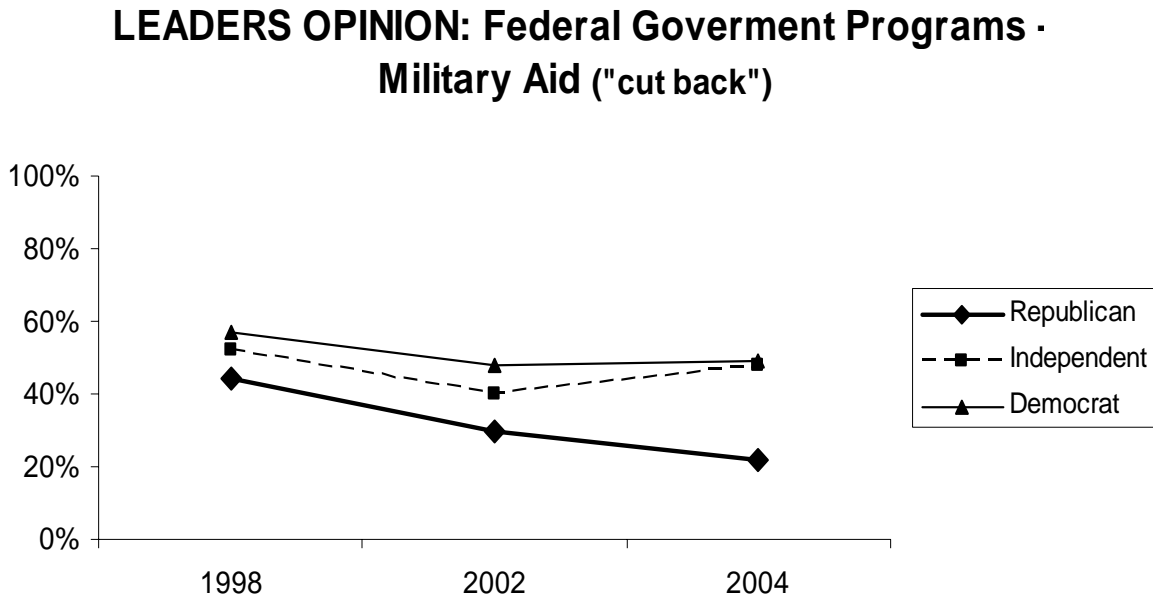

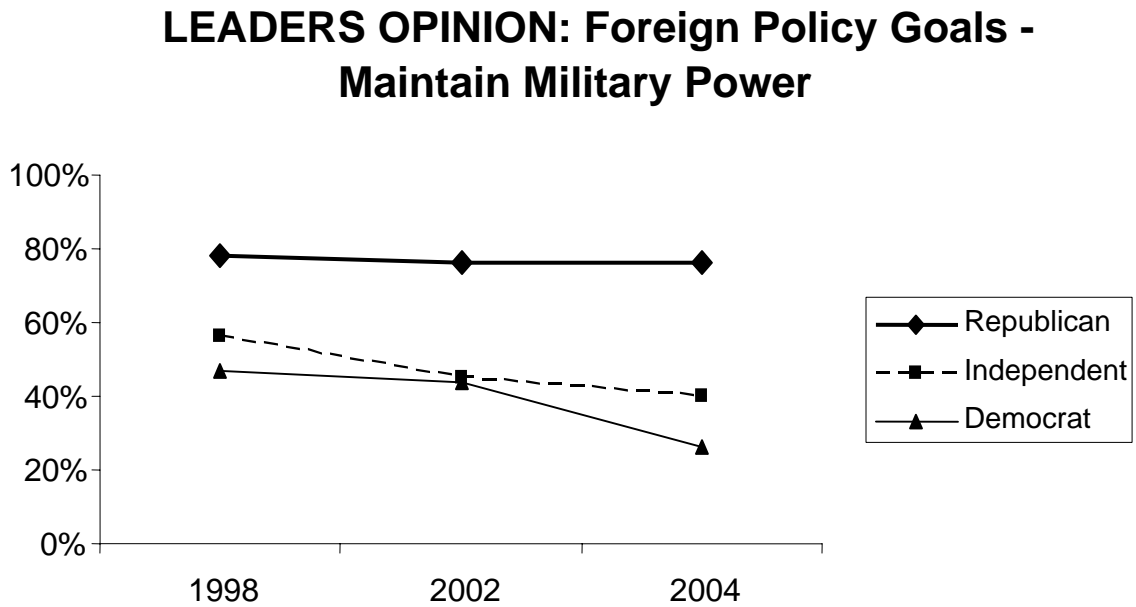

LEADERS OPINION: Foreign Policy Goals - Bring Democratic Form of Government to Other Nations

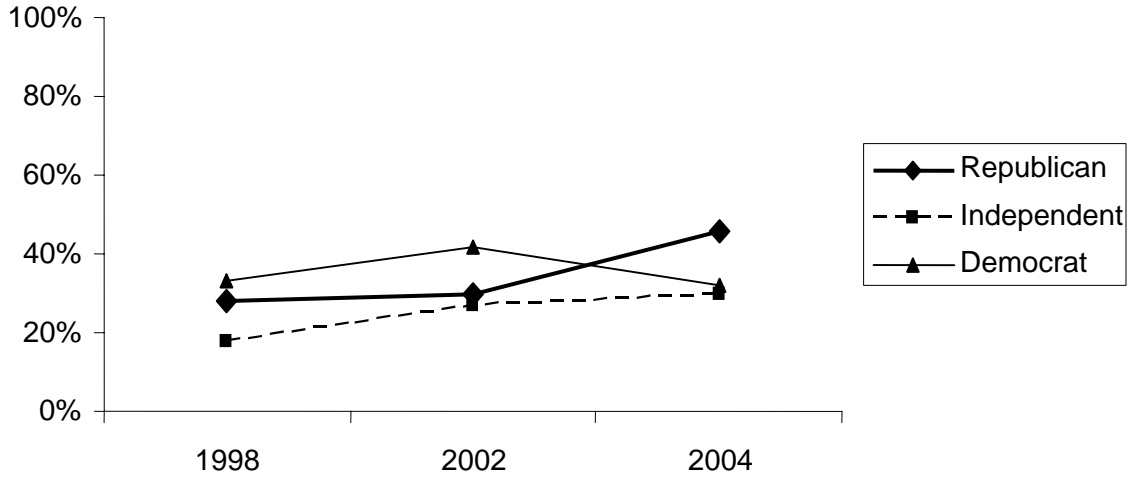

LEADERS OPINION: Foreign Policy Goals - Protecting American Jobs ('very important')

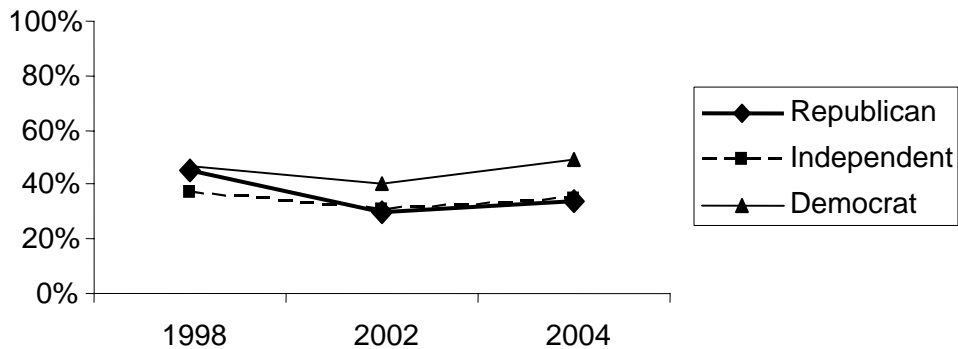

(‘very important’)**

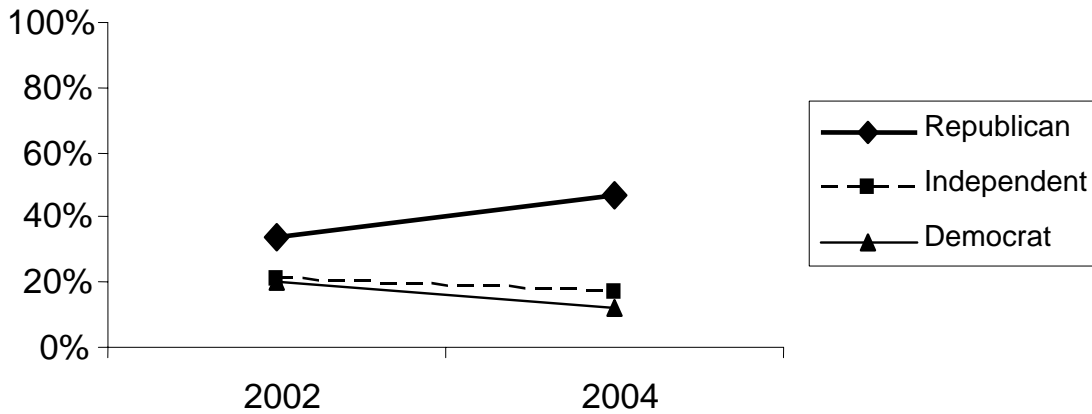

International Criminal Court ("support")**

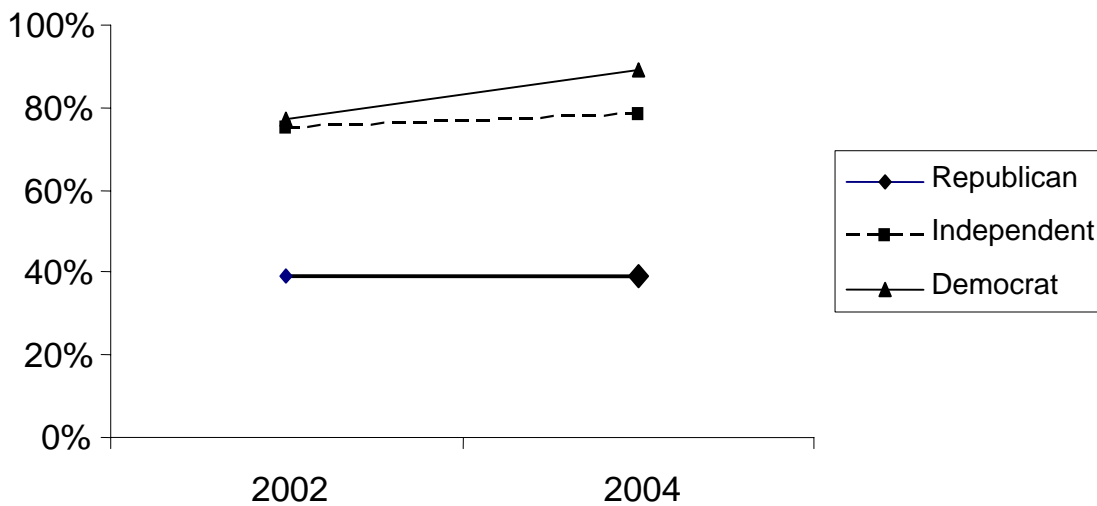

LEADERS OPINION: Treaties and Agreements - ICC ('support')

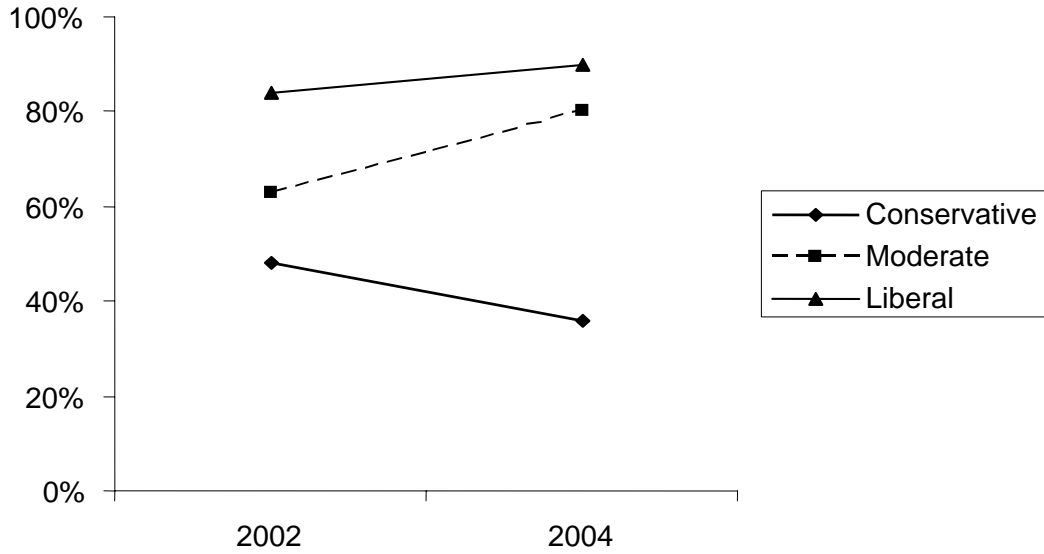

LEADERS OPINION: Use of US Troops - Government of Pakistan Request Help ("favor")

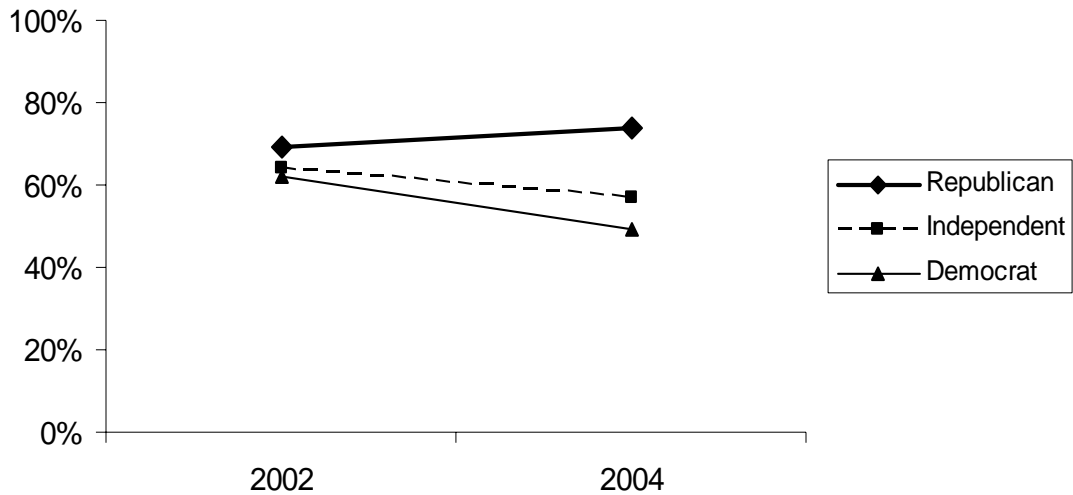

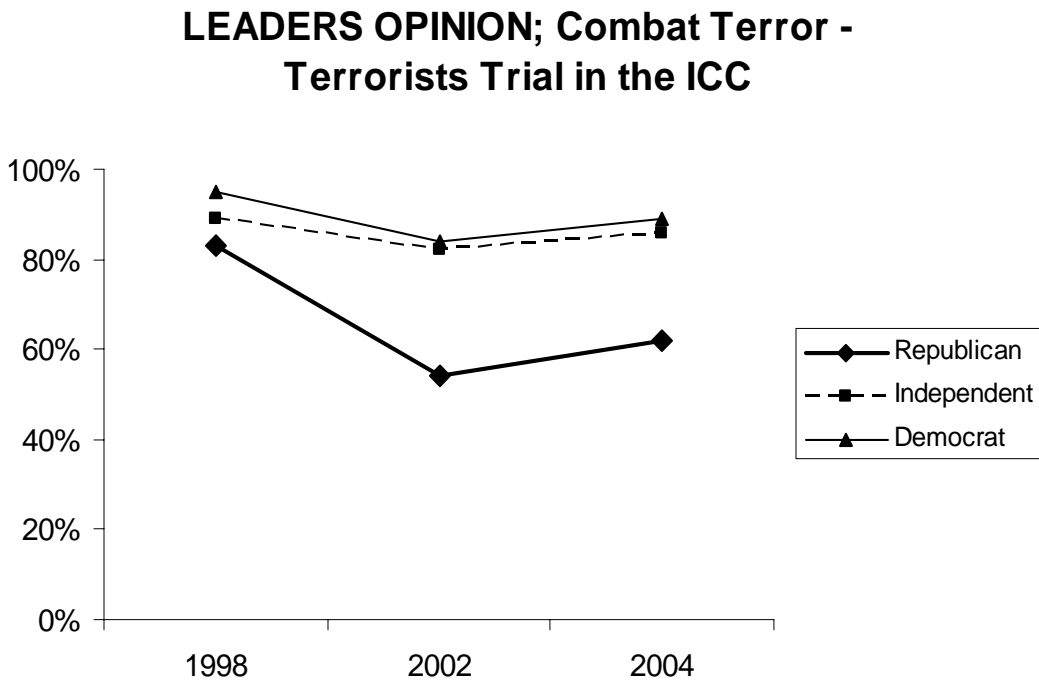

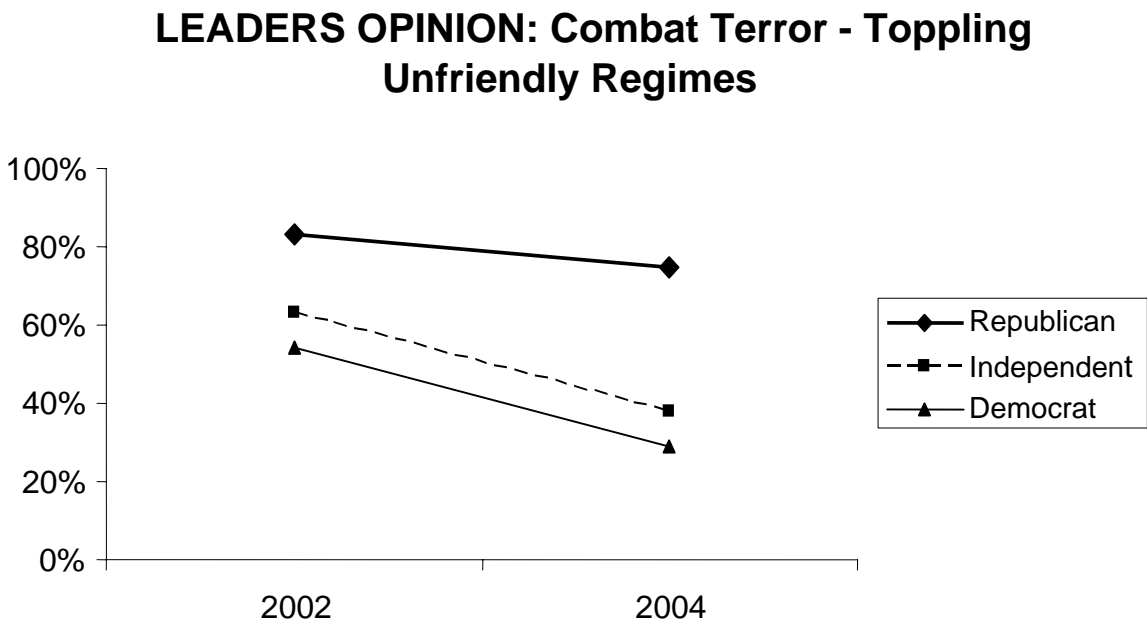

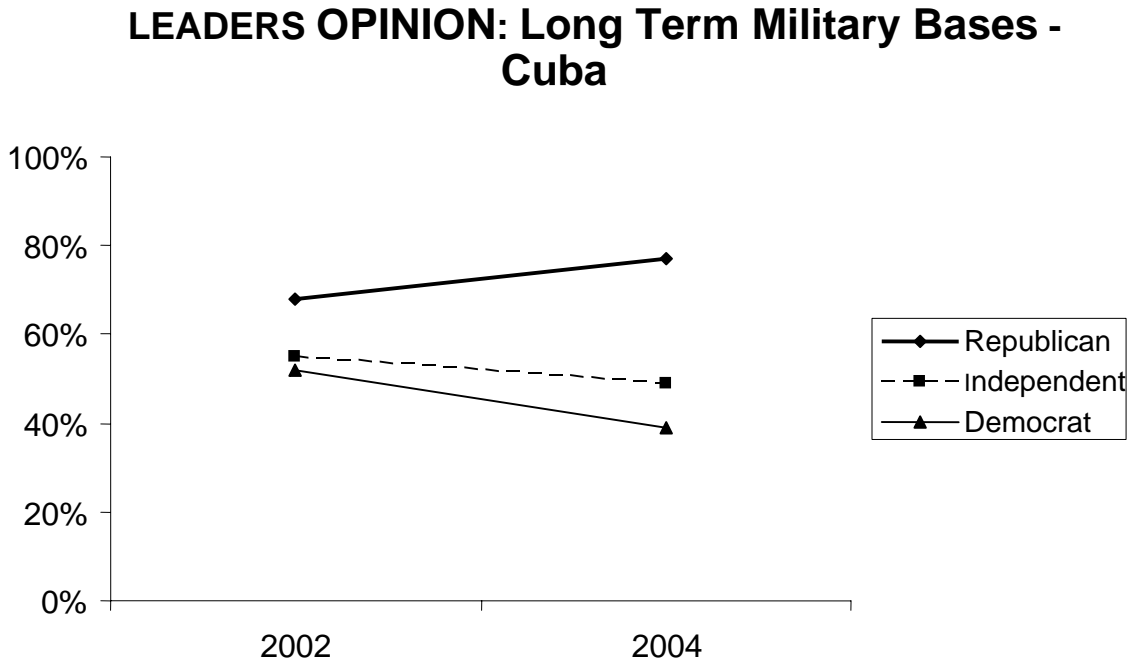

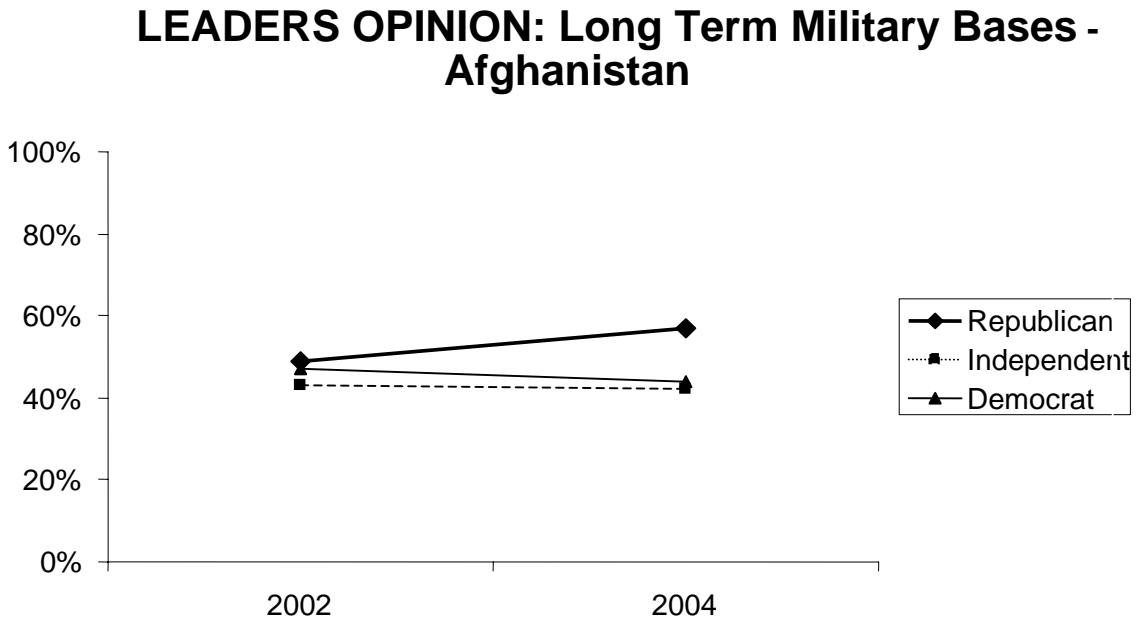

LEADERS OPINION: Long Term Military Bases - Uzbekistan

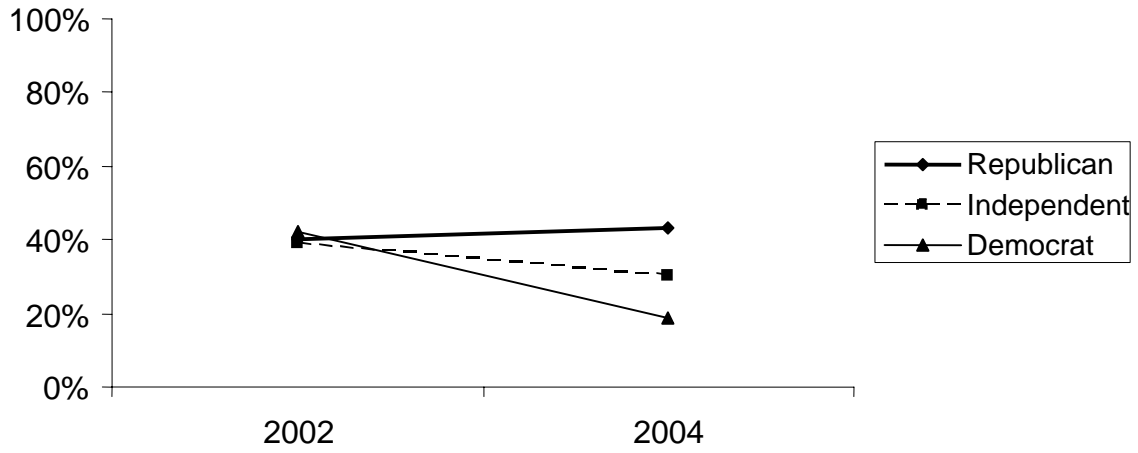

Program - Aid to Education ('expand')**

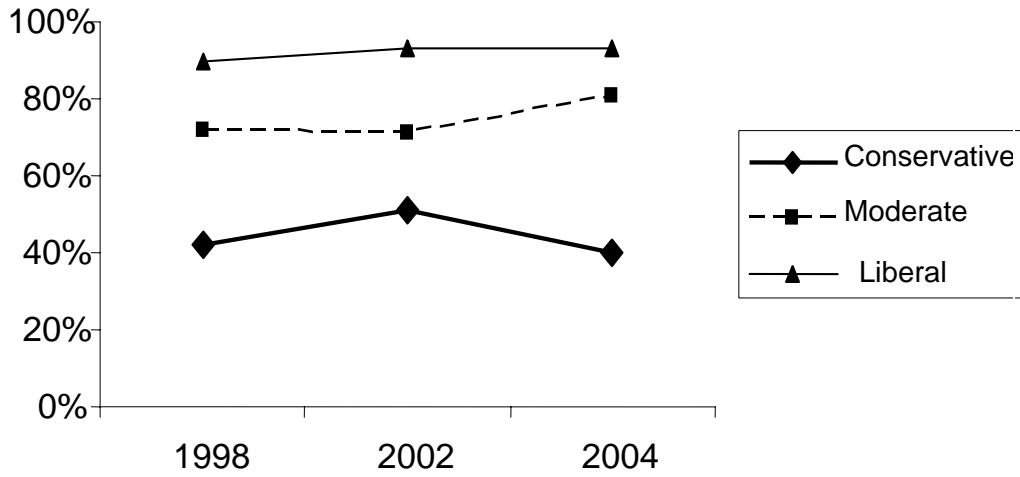

Aid to Education ('expand')**

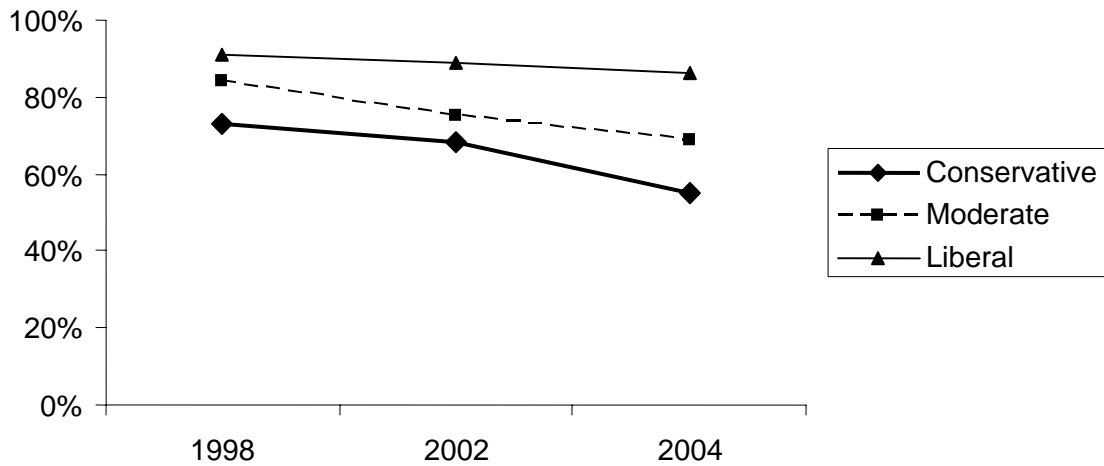

LEADERS OPINION: Federal Gov. Program - Social Security ('expand')

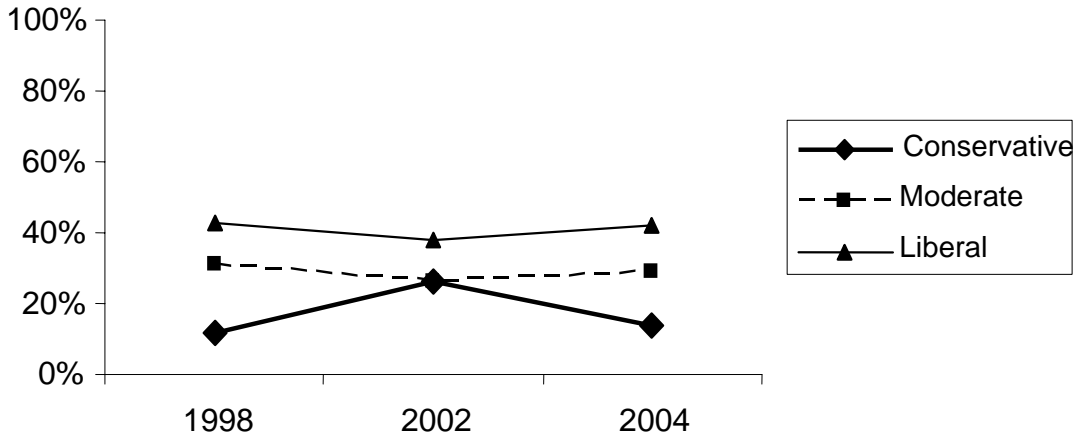

PUBLIC OPINION: Federal Gov. Program - Social Security ('expand')

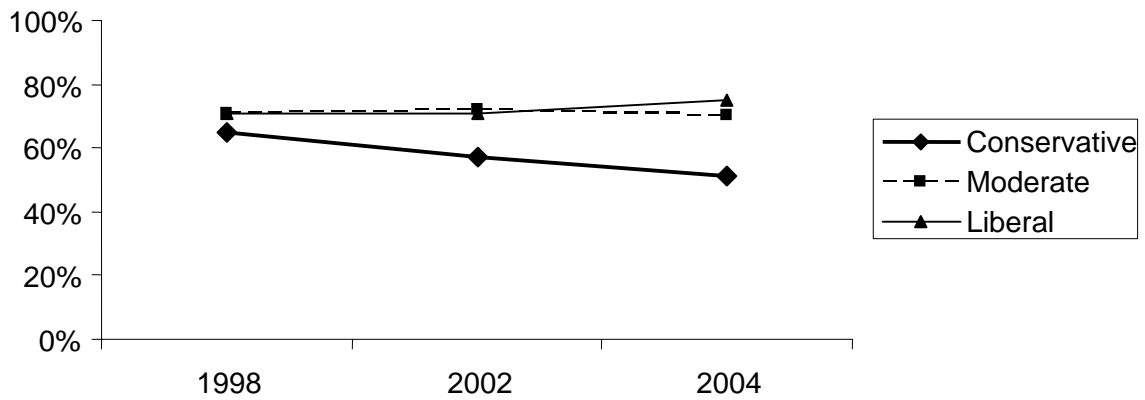

LEADERS OPINION: Federal Gov. Program - Health Care ('expand')

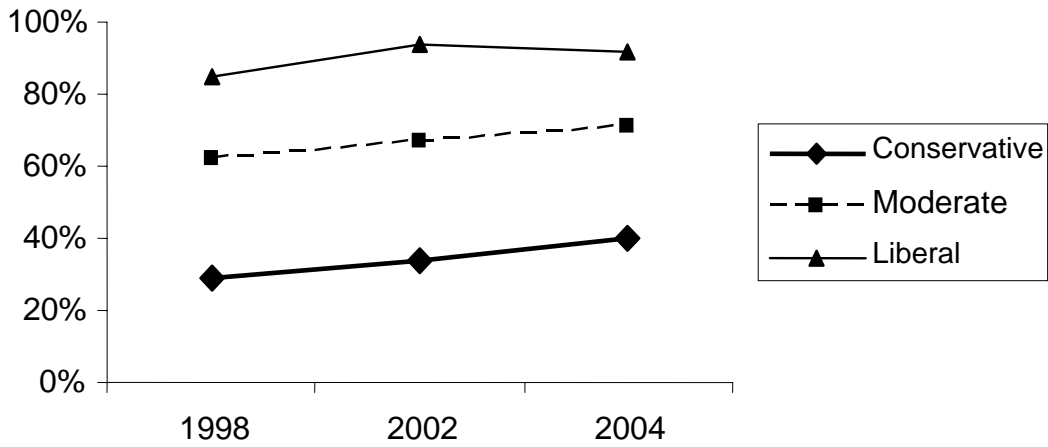

PUBLIC OPINION: Federal Gov. Program - Health Care ('expand')

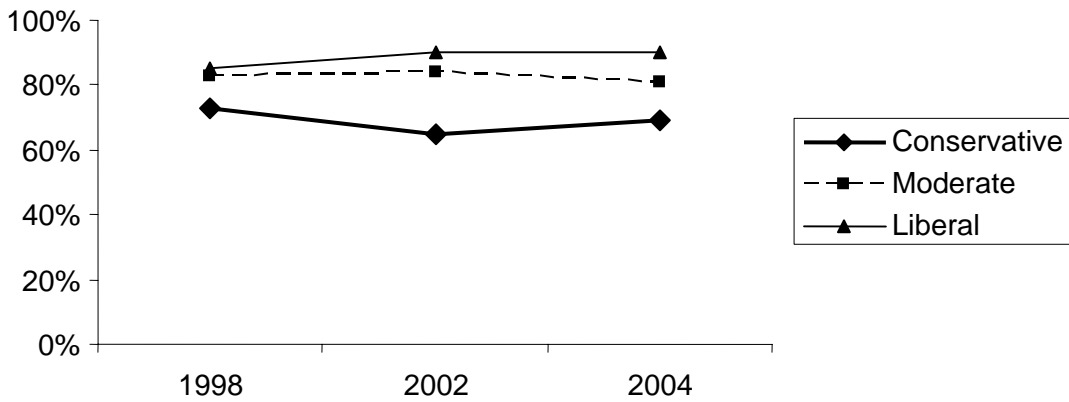

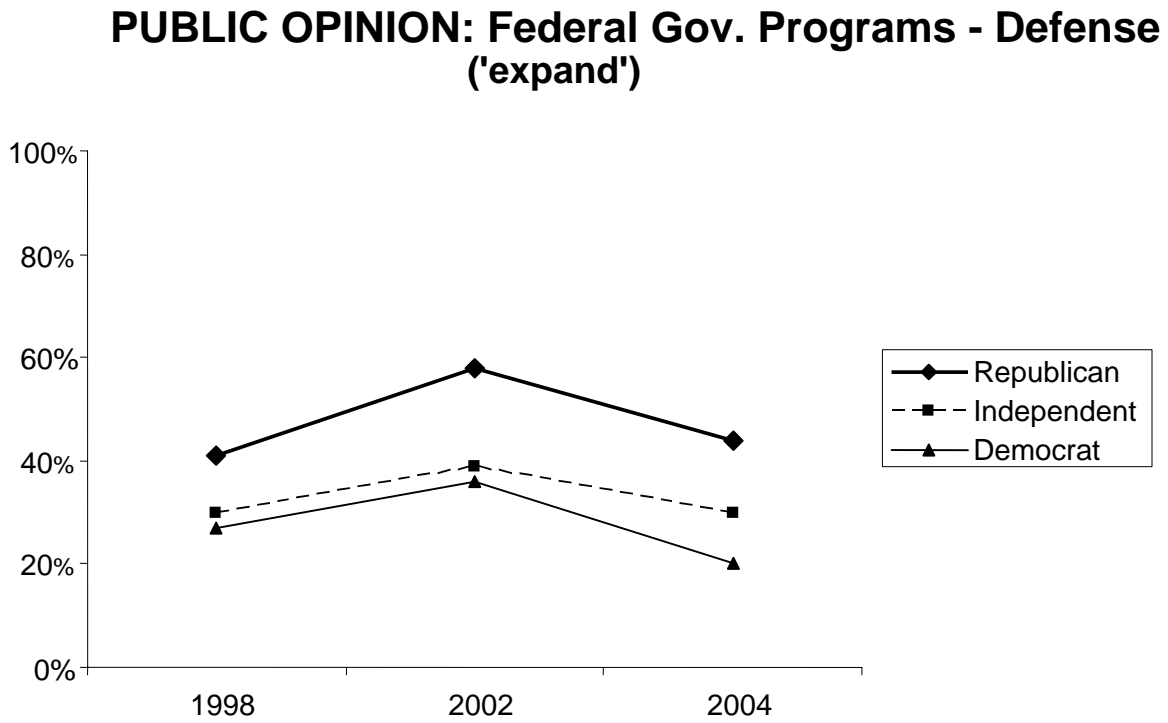

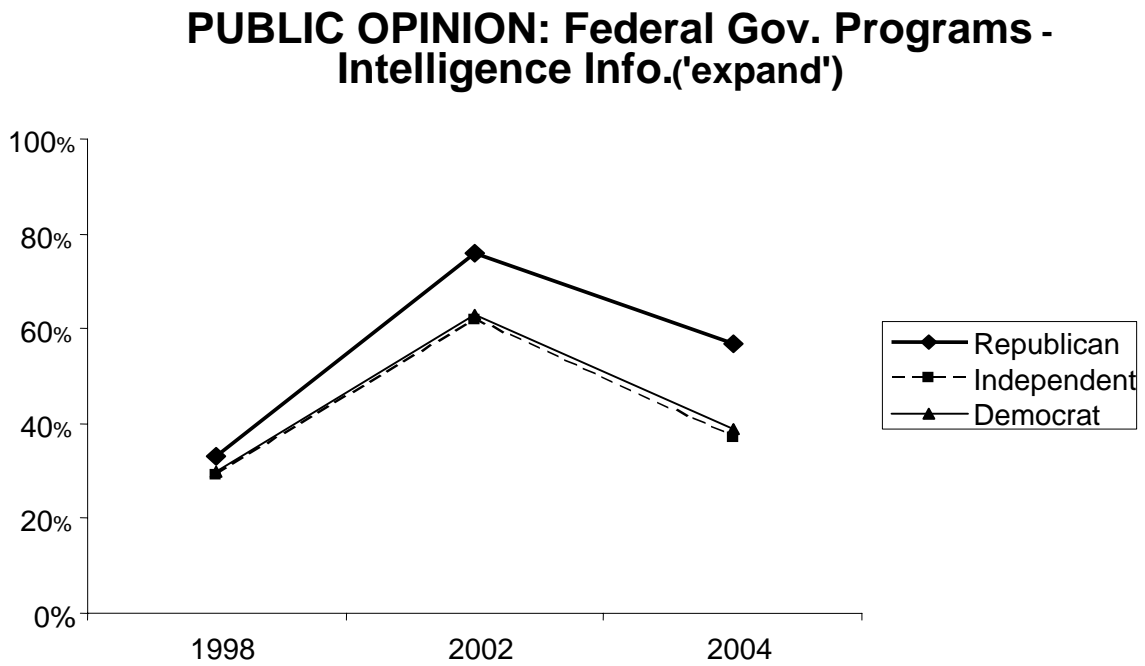

PUBLIC OPINION: Federal Government Programs - Foreign Military Aid ('cut back')

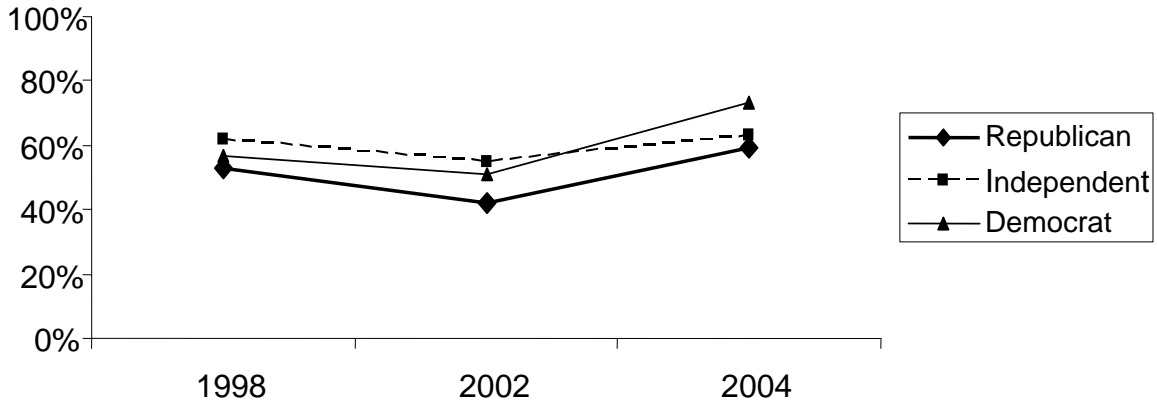

PUBLIC OPINION: Possible Vital Threats - Global Warming ('critical')

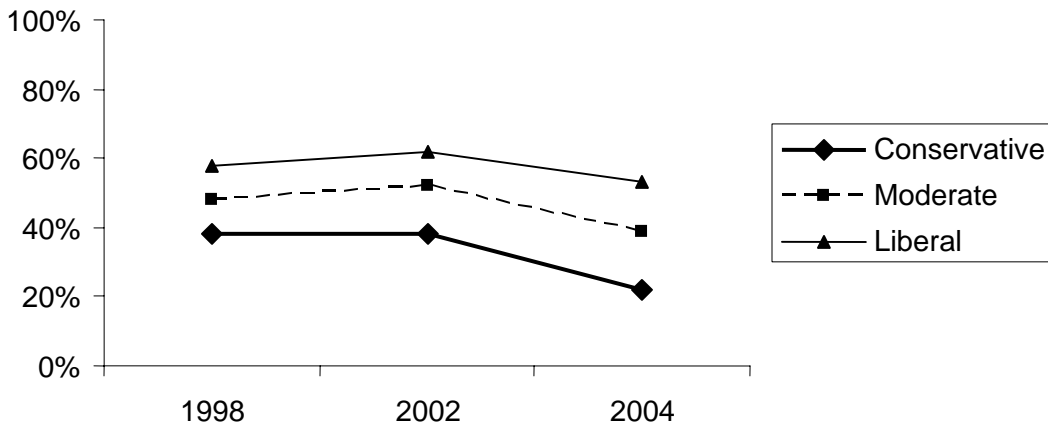

PUBLIC OPINION: Foreign Policy Goals - Strengthen the UN

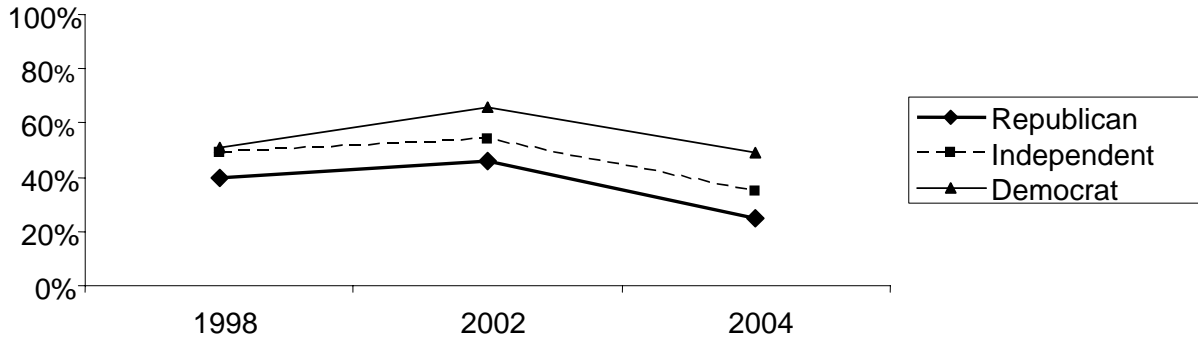

PUBLIC OPINION: Foreign Policy Goals - Combat Inter. Terror ('very important')

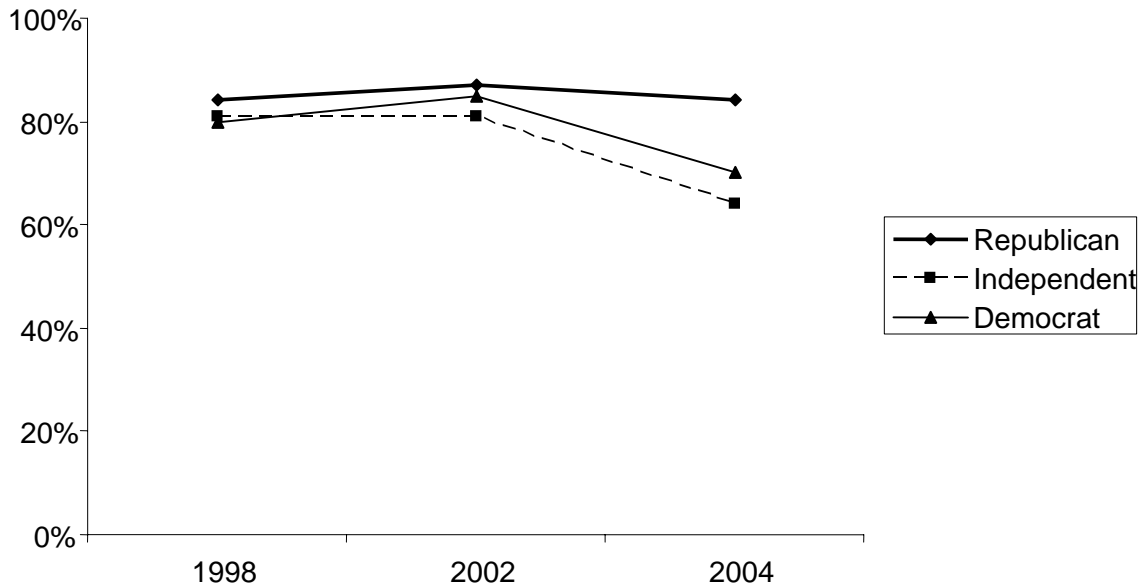

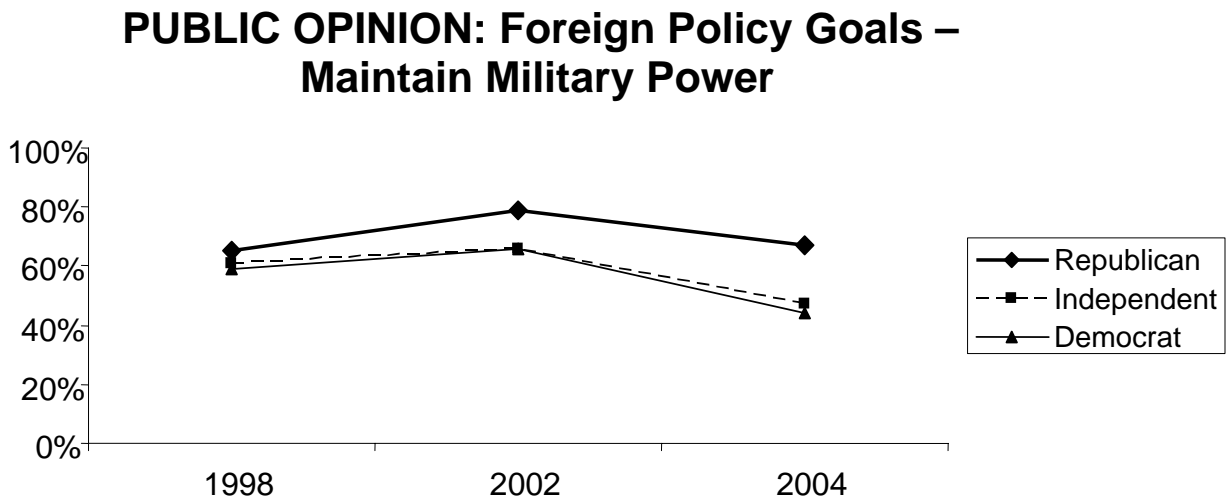

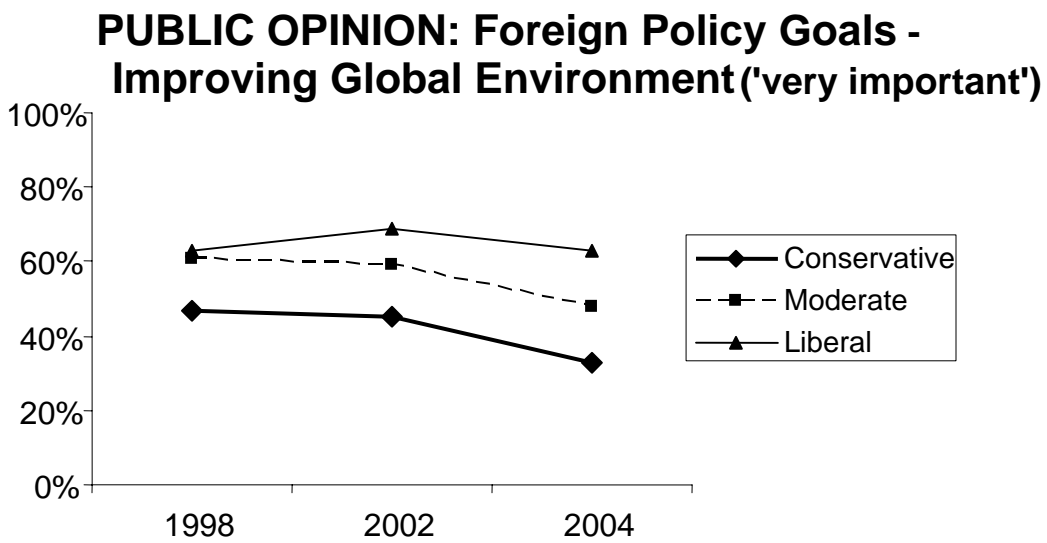

PUBLIC OPINION: Use of U.S Troops if Arab Forces Invade Israel ('strongly favor')

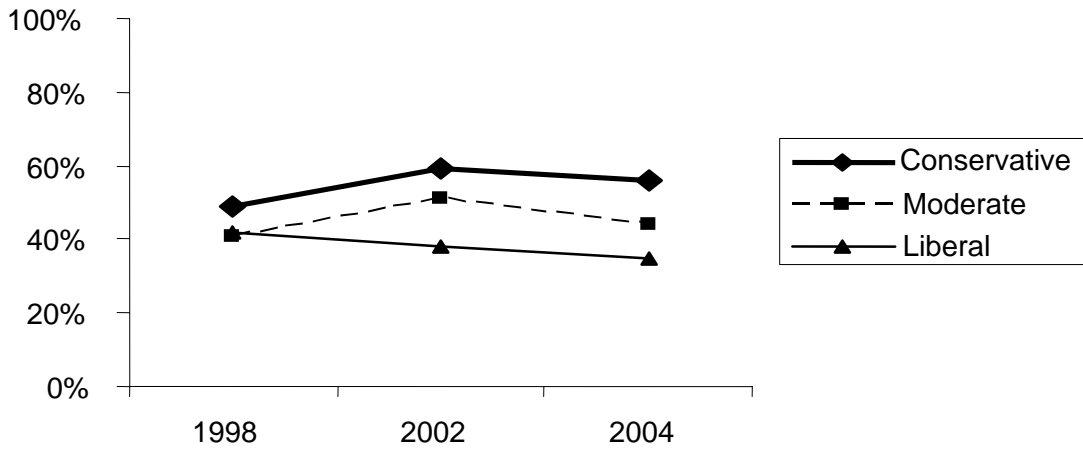

PUBLIC OPINION: Combat Terror - Toppling Unfriendly Regimes ('favor')

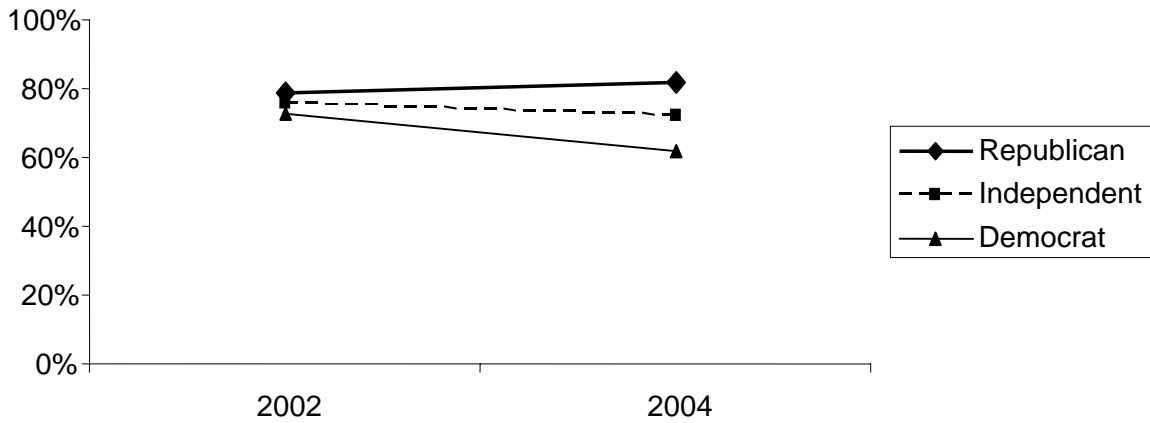

PUBLIC OPINION: Feelings Rating - France ('cold')

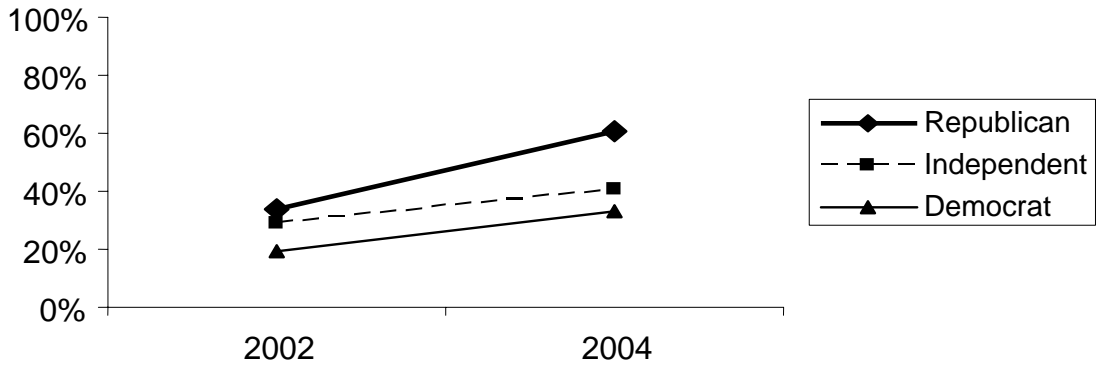

PUBLIC OPINION: Feelings Rating - UN ('cold')

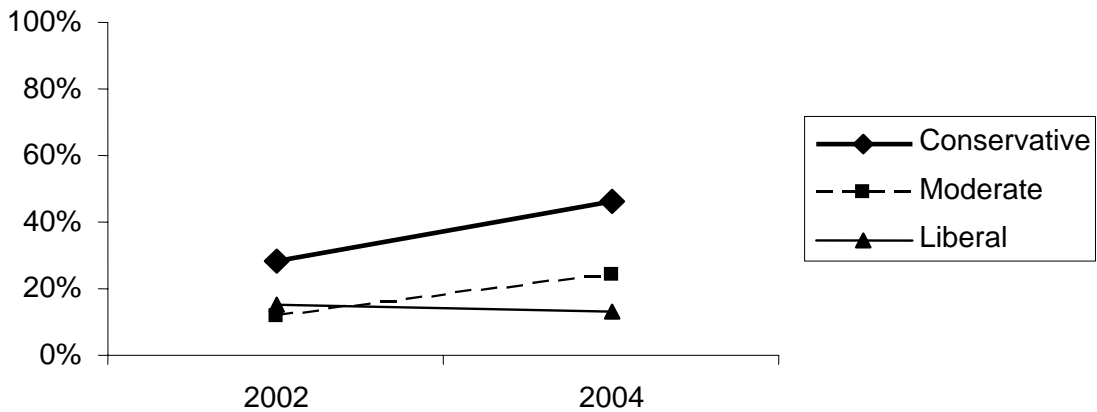
