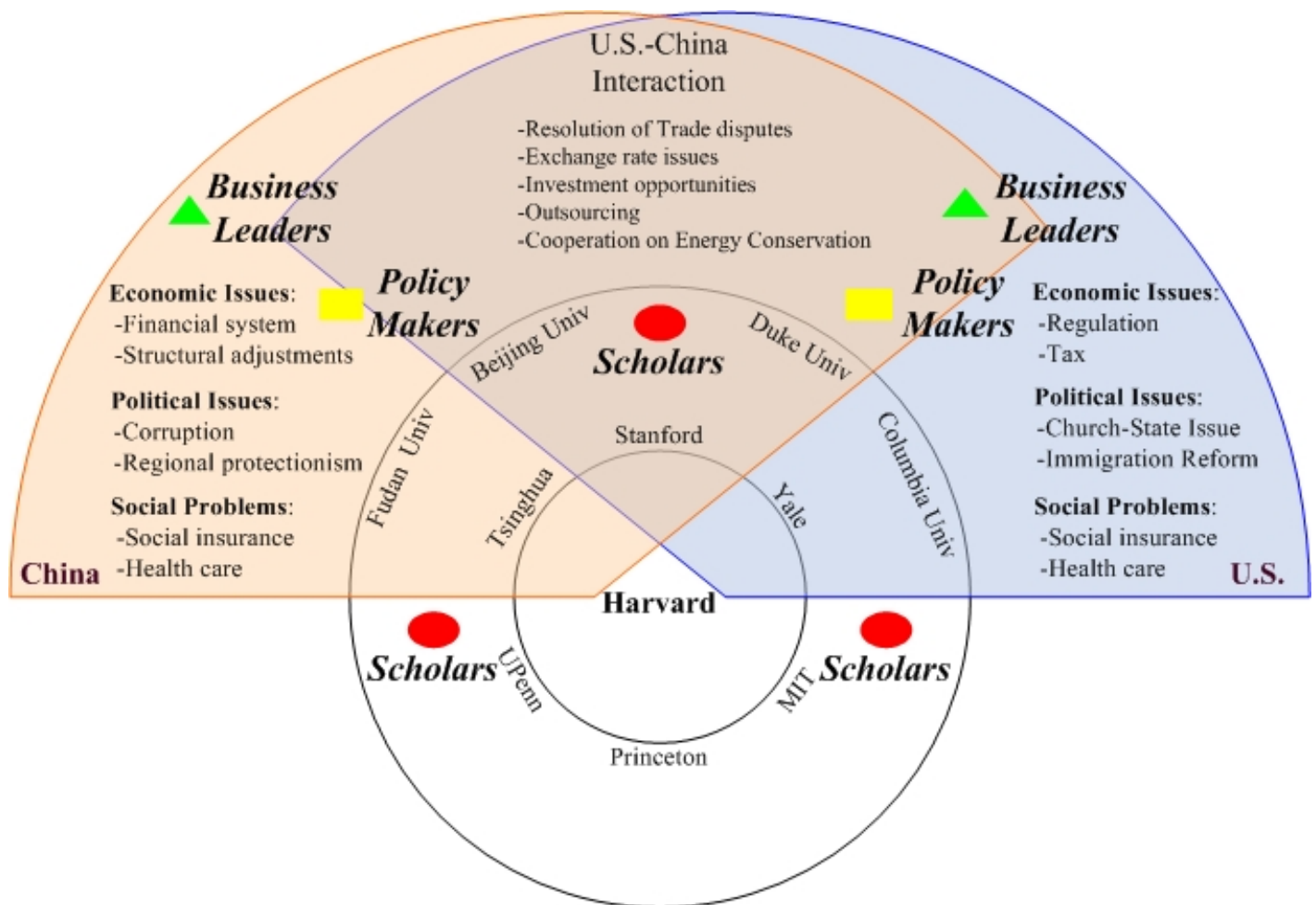

■ **The Mission**

of the “Harvard U.S.-China Economic Interaction Forum (UCEIF)” is to promote public discussion and problem-solving about the economic interaction between the U.S. and China , for the purpose of increasing the welfare of both countries. And to study, create and disseminate innovative win-win solutions to current and future economic problems between the U.S. and China.

■ **Our Action**

We have allied with the scholars and students from the most elite universities in the United States and China:

Harvard, Stanford, Yale, Princeton, MIT, UPenn, Duke, Tsinghua Univ, Beijing Univ et al.

We are creating a platform to examine the problems of China, U.S., the Issues between them and other global challenges, and to provide recommendations and solutions for policy makers and entrepreneurs.

■ **The Harvard U.S.-China Economic Review**

is a semiannual journal, which is planned to deepen the discussion and debate of the selected topics of the U.S.-China Economic Interaction Forum. Focusing on each year’s two or three hotspots in the economic interaction between the two countries, the journal will include the most inspiring ideas and thoughts of the top scholars from both countries. We hope it to be a high-profile platform for scholars, policy-makers, and entrepreneurs to interact with each other.

Particularly, the December issue, which is the Papers and proceedings (P&P) of the annual conference, is supposed to publish right after the Forum.

The June issue, will devote to collecting the most in-depth research on the topics covered by the previous conference and to elicit some new hotspots for future research.
