

**SUMMER INTERNSHIPS:
KSG/Harvard Opportunities
and Sources of Funding**

**Many deadlines for 2007/08 are still being set.
You may use last year's deadlines for reference.**

The opportunities listed below are divided into five categories:

Funding and internship opportunities within KSG
KSG funding and internship opportunities that are location-specific
Harvard University travel grants
Other Harvard opportunities
Outside opportunities

1. Funding and internship opportunities within KSG

Summer Internship Fund (SIF) - Provides modest summer stipends to first-year KSG students working in the public or not-for-profit sectors with organizations unable to provide funding.

Deadlines: Friday, March 14, 2008 at 5pm for Round 1
Friday, April 11, 2008 at 5pm for Round 2

Harvard International Development Internship Fund (HIDIF) - Awarding modest grants to first-year KSG students who undertake summer internships on development projects in developing countries.

Deadlines: Friday, March 14, 2008 at 5pm for Round 1
Friday, April 11, 2008 at 5pm for Round 2

There is a common application for the SIF and HIDIF grants, which is available on the SIF website.

Ash Institute for Democratic Governance and Innovation - places students with organizations who have won the Innovations in American Government Awards. They also offer stipends for independent research.

Deadline: extended to March 4, 2008

Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs - the Environment and Natural Resources Program at the offers the **Roy Family Summer Environmental Internship** - providing paid scholarships for innovative summer projects that ordinary would not offer a salary, thus allowing returning students to craft their own internship for a public, private or non-profit organization abroad or in the US.

Deadline: March 7, 2008

Carr Center for Human Rights Policy Internship Grants - Designed to allow the recipients to explore a research interest in human rights organization operations and effectiveness and to enhance his/her academic interests in human rights with valuable hands-on experience. The Center encourages grant recipients to use their summer internships as the foundation for a PAE or 2nd year paper related to the work of the organization.

Deadline: April 1, 2008.

Council of Women World Leaders - Paid fellowships are available to first-year Kennedy School Students to work in offices of organizations affiliated with the Council of Women World Leaders.

Deadline: EXTENDED to March 5, 2008.

Institute of Politics Graduate Summer Internship Stipends - Offering four \$3,500 stipends to KSG students who will be interning with an active political campaign or with a third party organization who is engaged in political activities related to campaigns. Applications available at the IOP.

Deadline: April 30, 2008

Joint Center for Housing Studies - in conjunction with Neighborworks America offers the **Emerging Leaders in Community and Economic Development Fellowship**. Fellows receive a \$7,000 stipend and will have the opportunity to present findings in Washington, D.C., at a Policy Briefing arranged by the Joint Center with key policy makers and practitioners.

Deadline: February 23, 2007

Michael S. Dukakis Governors' Summer Fellows Program - a nonpartisan fellowship program designed to prepare students for leadership in state government. Three \$7,000 fellowships are available for summer 2007.

Deadline: March 3, 9:00 am.

Shorenstein Center on the Press, Politics and Public Policy offers three opportunities:

News21 Internships - Up to four journalism internships which include a \$7500 stipend are now available through the Carnegie-Knight Initiative on the Future of Journalism Education.

Deadline: December 7, 2007

Lynette Lithgow Summer Internship in Journalism - Offering a \$3000 summer stipend to a Kennedy School student seeking to gain practical experience within the field of journalism.

Deadline: April 18, 2008

ABC NEWS INTERNSHIPS - \$7500 stipend for 10-week internship.

Deadline: March 14, 2008

Traub-Dicker-KSG Summer Research Fellowship - Awards \$5,000 to one KSG student to support summer research in the domain of policies affecting the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender (LGBT) communities.

Deadline: Friday, February 29, 2008 at 5pm

The Women and Public Policy Program (WAPPP) offers two opportunities:

The **Roy Family Summer Internship Program** for summer stipends to returning Kennedy School students to support internships on gender related programs/projects or work with women role models.

Deadline: Friday, March 7, 2008

The **Nancy Germeshausen Klavans Foundation Cultural Bridge Fellowship**, offering scholarships for summer internships to Kennedy School students to support work of specified women peace builders.

Deadline: Friday, March 7, 2008

2. KSG funding and internship opportunities that are location-specific

The **Rappaport Institute for Greater Boston** offers 12 graduate students summer internships in key state and local agencies in the Greater Boston area. Fellows receive a \$7000 stipend.

Deadline: Friday, January 26, 2007

Hefner China Fund - Modest grants for students pursuing internships and research in China.

Deadline: May 1, 2008

KSG in DC Summer 2007 internship stipend

The KSG Washington, D.C., Area Alumni Council will offer one summer internship stipend of \$1,000 to a Kennedy School student working in the greater DC area.

Deadline: April 23, 2007

KSG Mexico Program - Student grants available for work in public policy and international development.
Deadline: April 11, 2008

The Kokkalis Program on Southeastern and East-Central Europe may offer a limited number of small grants to be used towards undertaking non-paying (or low-paying) summer internship and/or research projects located in Southeastern Europe or concerning Southeastern Europe.
Deadline: April 16, 2007

The Vietnam Program at the Center for Business and Government offers opportunities with the Fulbright Economics Teaching Program.
Deadline: January 25, 2008

3. Harvard University travel grants

The Fellowships Office at the Office of Career Services of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences coordinates the application process for the **Summer Research Travel Grants** offered at many of the University's international research centers. To apply, use the common application available at the link above.
Deadline: February 26, 2008, at noon

David Rockefeller Center for Latin American Studies (DRCLAS) - Assists students in finding a summer internship in Latin America or related to Latino communities in the United States, and also offers summer opportunities, including:

4. Other Harvard opportunities

CASE Fellowship Program - The Council of Alumni for Social Enterprise (CASE) is a non-profit organization made up of alumni from the various schools at Harvard who want to demonstrate their deep support for the increased focus on social enterprise at the University. CASE awards summer fellowships graduate students to conduct summer research and to write best practice cases on social enterprise organizations. Program on Negotiation Summer Fellowships Program at Harvard Law School - Offers fellowship grants to students who are doing internships or undertaking summer research projects in negotiation and dispute resolution.

Deadline: March 20, 2008

5. Outside Opportunities

The **Everett Public Services Internship Program** offers stipends for internships at organizations affiliated with the program. **Deadlines vary.**

The **New England Council** awards summer stipends of \$2,000 for housing and expenses to selected students from New England who have obtained a summer internship in a New England delegation

congressional office.

Deadline: May 15, 2008

The **Conference on Asian Pacific Leadership** awards scholarships to outstanding Asian Pacific American college undergraduate and graduate students who are interning in the Washington, DC metropolitan area during the summer. The scholarships are intended to enable outstanding Asian Pacific American scholars with leadership potential to work full-time and learn about ways to influence public policy in their local communities. Scholarships are typically in the amount of \$2000.

Deadline: December 17, 2007

If you are a **PPIA Fellow**, you may be able to get summer funding through the PPIA program. Contact the PPIA program for details.
