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

Context and Purpose

- 2.6 million K-12 homeschool students in the USA, March of 2020
- Based on state-provided data, US Census Bureau data, and other sources; I estimate 4.5-5.0 million March of 202 I



Changing Demographics

- For decades, families of median income for families with children; 2016* "poor" 21%,; US 2019 "poverty" 10%
- For decades, data suggested couple more years formal education for homeschool parents; 2016 less than high school, 15%; US 2019, 12,%
- For decades, noticeably disproportionately white; 2016 white, non-Hispanic, 59%; US Census B. 2019, 60%
- Main reasons for homeschooling have shifted over time

* 2016 in this slide indicates USDE, NHES 2016 data.

- This quickly growing form of education ...
- Rapidly increasing number of studies past 15-20 years
- Yet most research uses <u>non-representative</u> <u>samples of median-income white Americans</u>

Contribution

- State-representative sample of homeschooling families
- A fragile community recruited to the panel through randomized double-blind methods
- Demographic variables do not explain much variation in homeschooling
- Four perceived barriers
 - laws, child concerns, socialization, knowledge
 - negative predictors of now homeschooling and desire to homeschool

Definitions

- Homeschooling is parent-led home-based private education; that is, parents currently privately homeschooling at least one school-age child (in grades K-12)
- Fragile communities are areas where groups of people are characterized by high proportions who are struggling in their daily lives and have limited opportunities for social and economic mobility
 - Low income and Black persons tend to be overrepresented in fragile communities

Data

- Nationally representative online panel
- 800 Low-income families: \$40,000 or less, children ages
 2-18, in Georgia
- 68 questions that related to respondents' self-perceived barriers about homeschooling

 Data were collected before the government restrictions regarding Covid-19 Selected demographics

Data reduction

- Code 67 Likert items in increasing order and standardize
- 11 themes for 63 items factor analysis & agreement (2 coders)
- Retain first principal component for these 11 themes
- Total 17 outcomes:
 - 11 themes, 5 standalone questions and 1 dichotomous variable

Original survey questions

Do you desire to homeschool your child(ren)? – **Desire to homeschool**

Are you currently privately homeschooling at least one school-age (i.e., in grades K-12) child? – **Now homeschooling**

I do not understand the homeschool laws in my state – **Don't** understand laws

I was homeschooled and my experiences make me think I should not homeschool my children – **Was homeschooled**

Themes – socialization and knowledge

Concern about social isolation of my child/children

Concern that children will not have good social development

I do not know how to get started homeschooling

I do not understand what homeschooling looks like in practice

Takeaways

- Uniqueness of this study
 - Representative sample
 - Focus on Black families: Fragile community
 - Focus on barriers to homeschooling
- Demographics don't explain much of the variation in homeschooling
- Four barriers: laws, child concerns, socialization, knowledge
- More barriers faced by fragile families that do not already homeschool their children versus those that currently do
- Limitations: external validity. Need replication with larger representative sample
